NEW PATIENT CONSULTATION

Initial visit with physician or physician assistant (PA), includes:

Vascular ultrasound

Identify the source of vein disease through non-invasive imaging

Discuss ultrasound results

- Personalized treatment plan
- If necessary, initiate conservative therapy for 90 days

Insurance approval

Can take 30-90 days for insurance approval after conservative therapy.

OUTPATIENT PROCEDURE

Schedule procedure with physician based on your individualized treatment plan:

- Venous ablation
- Sclerotherapy
- Stab phlebectomy

6-12 months or as needed

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Venous reflux disease develops when your veins become damaged or diseased. Contributing factors include age, family history, obesity, multiple pregnancies and professions that require standing. If left untreated, venous reflux disease may worsen over time.

Symptoms of vein insufficiency

- Varicose or spider veins
- Restless legs
- Aches, pain, swelling, heaviness or fatigue in the legs or ankles
- Skin changes such as dry, itchy skin, redness or brown discoloration
- Ulcers, open wounds or sores

Our vein specialists use minimally-invasive techniques such as

- Radiofrequency vein ablation
- Sclerotherapy
- Ambulatory Phlebectomy
